

Camera Ready Format for ICACT2006

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Abstract — These instructions give you basic guidelines for preparing camera-ready papers for ICACT2006 (International Conference on Advanced Communication Technology), February 20-22, 2006, at Phoenix Park, South Korea. Use a long dash after the words “Abstract” and “Keywords”. The abstract is to be in 9-point, single spaced type, and should not exceed 100 words.

Keywords — Preparation of papers, camera-ready, two-column format, IEEE format.

1. Introduction

These guidelines include complete descriptions of the fonts, spacing, and related information for producing your paper. Because standard paper sizes are different on either side of the Atlantic, this Word template can only produce the correct text area if A4 paper is selected in your printer driver (using the Page Setup command or its Windows equivalent).

2. The appearance of the document

In formatting your page, set the top margin to 19 mm (0.75 in) and the left margin to 18 mm (0.7 in). If you are using A4 paper, set the right margin to 12 mm and the bottom margin to 37 mm. If you are using 8½ in × 11 in paper, set the right margin to 18 mm (0.7 in) and the bottom margin to 19 mm (0.75 in). This gives a column length of 24 cm (9.5 in). The column width is 88 mm (3.45 in). The space between two columns is about 5mm (0.2 in). Paragraph indentation is about 3.5 mm (0.14 in).

Left - and right - justify your columns. Use two columns in all pages, always. Your paper should be no longer than 6 pages and you should try to fill your last page as much as possible. If the last page of your paper is only partially filled, arrange the columns so that they are evenly balanced if possible, rather than having one long column.

Type your main text in 10-point Times, single-spaced. Do not use double spacing. All paragraphs should be indented 1/2-inch (0.5 cm). Please do not place any additional blank lines between paragraphs.

Author names and affiliations are to be centered beneath the title and printed in Times 11-point, non-boldface type. Multiple authors may be shown in a two- or three-column format, with their affiliations below their respective names. Affiliations are centered below each author name, italicized, not bold. Include e-mail addresses if possible. Follow the author information by two blank lines before main text.

Sponsor acknowledgment comes here. (This is the only footnote allowed in the paper).

3. Helpful Hints

Figure and table captions should be 8-point Helvetica (or a similar sans-serif font), boldface. Initially capitalize only the first word of each figure caption and table title. Figures and tables must be numbered separately. Figure captions are to be below the figures. Table titles are to be centered above the tables.

List and number all bibliographical references in 8-point Times, single spaced, at the end of your paper. When referenced in the text, enclose the citation number in square brackets, for example [1].

Number equations in parenthesis flush with the right margin,

$$2jk \frac{\partial u}{\partial z} = \frac{\partial^2 u}{\partial x^2} + k^2 (n^2 - \beta^2) u . \quad (1)$$

Refer to “(1)”, not “Eq. (1)” or “Equation (1)”, except at the beginning of a sentence: “Equation (1) is...”. Appendixes, if needed, appear before the acknowledgment, which in turn appears before the last section of the paper: References. Do not put figures or anything else after the references. Do not number appendix, acknowledgment and reference sections.
